Safety Caution for Cannon Field Entrance

Have you been to Cannon Field lately? As you know, Toyota's new plant is less than five miles directly north of the field and the road construction has been heavy, to say the least. Our geography from the air looks a lot different than before. The east entrance to the field now has a turn lane off from Loop 1604, which is meant for traffic turning onto Applewhite Road. Please use caution when making the turn to enter the field as the entrance is very obscured by the mounds of dirt and signs. It is suggested that you use the west entrance until grading and construction in the area is complete. Once the Department of Transportation has completed the project, four lanes will run directly in front of the property. This of course means more traffic and hazards once production starts at Toyota.
